Farewell, My Friend, Beatrice Toney Bailey (Sheridan Books): A step-by-

step guide that leads you through what to do when a loved one receives a diagnosis, the necessary actions that need to be taken during the dying process, and navigating the grief process.

The Cancer Journals, Audre Lorde (Aunt Lute). Essays and journal writings by the poet Audre Lorde about her experience with breast cancer. Riveting and direct.

When Breath becomes Air, Paul Kalanithi (Random House): A 36 year-old neurosurgeon faces his own mortality.
