EBMC:

What brought you to East Bay Meditation Center and what is your current position or title at EBMC?

A friend suggested I attend a beginning meditation class that was being led by Mushim. I enjoyed that class so much that I immediately decided to become a volunteer at EBMC. I first started volunteering in the role of back up supplies manager, then began to volunteer as a Teacher Event Assistant or TEA. After approximately a year of volunteering at EBMC, the position of Event Intern was posted, I applied, and the rest is history! I was later promoted to Event Coordinator, the position I currently hold.
